"I Hope You Know"

The night of the Lord's betrayal, started it all; all the heartache, all the sorrow, all the confusion, all the pain, and all the rejection. The night of the Lord's betrayal began a pattern of our Lord being left, rejected, forsaken, that could only end in His deepest agony, the agony that brought forth great drops of sweat mixed with blood in the garden of Gethsemane. That dreadful night, some left Him permanently, some left Him prematurely, while others left Him predictively.

Having just shared the Passover meal, Jesus spoke to His betrayer Judas, "What you do, do quickly" (John 13:27). John records Judas went out immediately. You see, Judas permanently left Him (Matt 27:5). Gathered in the garden, Jesus was approached by a mob of soldiers lead by Judas. Thinking they would defend their Master, some began to confront the mob (Matt 26:51). Jesus intervened and reminded them His power was greater than that of the sword, and that this must take place in order to fulfill the scriptures. "Then all the disciples forsook Him and fled" (Matt 26:56). Perhaps they thought they had defended their Savior, but sadly they prematurely left Him. When Jesus told of His coming betrayal and being forsaken, Peter confidently protested saying, "Even if all are made to stumble because of You, I will never be made to stumble" (Matt 26:33). Jesus said, "Before the rooster crows, you will deny me three times" (Matt 26:75). Peter did predictively forsake Him.

Yet what brought Him sorrow in the garden, what made Him weep sweat with blood, what brought angels from heaven to strengthen Him, would be that at the cross He would be forsaken purposefully. At the cross, the weight of sin would be thrust upon Him fully, as result, at the cross His Father could not look favorably upon the Son (II Cor 5:21; Gal 3:13). So much left the Lord leading to the cross and at the cross, what did not leave Him was the power of the 22nd Psalm.

David wrote of the Redeemer Who would come to secure the fellowship with the Lord for all eternity (Psalms 16:10-11). He wrote how the Messiah would establish the kingdom of the Lord (Psalms 2:6). He even wrote how the Messiah would reign over all the nations (Psalms 2:8). Yet his most vivid Psalm of Jesus, (did we not know better), would appear to us that David was an eyewitness to the crucifixion, yet his words were 1,000 years before Jesus, before crucifixion, before Rome, before it was time. This is unlike any of the other Psalms, particularly the Psalms of David. The glorious words of Psalm 22, are void, empty, free, of any admittance of sin on the part of the sufferer. Even when reproached by enemies and afflicted, there is still an admittance of guilt of some form of sin on the part of the Psalmist. Not here; not in Psalm 22. This is the greatest glimpse to the heart of the Holy Spirit.

Nearly every aspect you know of the Lord's day of death, the darkest day on the earth, is found in Psalm 22: Jesus' dying words (22:1, see Matthew 27:46, Mark 15:34); the wagging of the heads (22:7, see Matthew 27:39); the mocking of the crowd (22:8, see Matthew 27:43); His cry for thirst (22:15, see John 19:28); the piercing of His hands and feet (22:16); His unbroken bones (22:17, see John 19:33); the staring of the crowd (22:17, see Matthew 27:36); the casting of lots for His garments (22:18, see Matthew 27:35). I hope you know, were the Bible void of any other words concerning Jesus Christ and His sin sacrifice, save the words of Psalm 22, we would still be able to believe, "My Lord and My God!"

May for Meribah

While many of us are familiar with Summer Camp at Meribah, I often wonder if we are really aware of the impact this mission has on the youth of Hickman County and the Kingdom of God. The enrollment for the past three years has been 235 (2008), 266 (2009), and 269 (2010). The Day Camp which operates during the week of VBS has averaged approximately 50 campers during this same period. On average less than 45% of campers are from our congregation. This means that over 55% are not members or affiliated with the Centerville Church. For many of these young people this is the most Christ-centered instruction and activities they will have during the year, and for some it will be their only Christ-centered experiences during that time.

Camp sews the seeds of the Gospel in the youth of our community. While the harvest of some may be years away, we see on average 13 baptisms each year during camp or directly after the close of camp. We will never really know how many have come to know our Savior through camp, but I can assure you it far exceeds the yearly average we do know about.

It is a desire of the camp staff to never turn down a potential camper based on financial concerns. If this was to happen we would be turning away a willing soul who desires to learn about and experience the Good News of our Lord. With this in mind, scholarships provided through the donation of individuals and the "Paul Rogers Memorial Golf Scramble" play a significant role in the number of young people able to attend camp. Over the past 3 years approximately 25% of campers have benefited from these scholarships, averaging \$8,700 each year. We anticipate the need for scholarships to increase this year.

With the approval of the elders we are using the month of May to bring to the attention of the congregation the need for individual donations for camp scholarships. One full-scholarship would require a donation of \$180 with partial scholarships being in any amount designated by the donor. Funds for scholarships can be given to the Deacons overseeing our Youth Ministry (Brian Qualls, Mike Elkins, Lonnie Mayberry and David Hudgins), Youth Minister Chris Webb or Camp Director Clay Chessor. Scholarship donations can also be left with the church staff during the week. Also, during the month of May, Youth Deacons and Camp staff will be in the lobby after morning services each Sunday accepting any amount of donations from individuals for the scholarship fund.

In closing I will quote our Lord from the book of Matthew, "Jesus said, "Let the little children come to me, and do not hinder them, for the kingdom of heaven belongs to such as these."

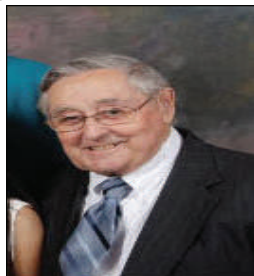
