- 4) The Messenger (in full color and two days earlier) will be emailed to you each Tuesday afternoon by 6:00pm. You may electronically save it for future reference.

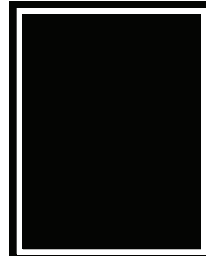
