"I Hope You Know"

In order to prepare for the coming eternity of tomorrow, our Lord taught we cannot not afford any delay, today. Jesus calls those who are His, those of this world, out of darkness and into His light of love and life. By the very nature of that calling, all of our life is changed and transformed into His image. Part of our preparation for tomorrow, includes what we do today with the things our Lord places in our care. Of the Lord's parables, stewardship was a focus in three of His earthly stories with heavenly meaning. Sometimes we consider stewardship in terms only pertaining to money, and our handling of it in a responsible manner.

Whatever we cannot surrender, whatever we cannot give up and lay over to the control and guidance of God, which is the one thing which possesses us, and in reality, possesses our soul, and will hamper our soul from receiving its eternal reward. Such would be the dilemma in the life of the man of Luke 12 we know as the rich fool. The Lord tells this parable in response to a question asked by a member of the great multitude following Jesus. At first glance this question seems to come out of the blue, when Jesus had been teaching on what seems to be such separate matters. But when you stop to consider how Jesus responded, slowly the relationship between what He was saying and why this question was asked is made clear by the Master teacher.

He had spoken words of caution (Luke 12:1-3). Our hearts and our lives are so easily influenced and so easily swayed by the world around us and whatever we allow ourselves to be exposed to in the moment can captivate us. The influence of the Pharisees was worth avoiding, and Jesus wanted His followers warned of their hypocrisy. They were strict when it came to enforcing the laws on others, but for themselves the strictness was not the same.

Counting our dollars and cents, our Lord has counted the hairs of our head, and numbered them one by one. While we're busy preparing for holding on to all our possessions, heaven's eternity is slipping through our fingers. Yet when we make our confession, compelling us to faithful



obedience, then we find a true richness "toward God." (Luke 12:21).

He had spoken words of concern (Luke 12:4-7). Hell is a reality, and eternity ought to be a priority, but we seldom speak of eternity in terms of the dangers of separation from God via the confines of hell. Jesus made it abundantly clear, death of the body is minor, compared to the eternal pain of the real place known as hell. Jesus had spoken words of confession (Luke 12:8-12). His call for His people is to have an open lifestyle spoken and shown in faith and following of their devotion and commitment to God.

Then comes the words of the parable, "beware of covetousness" (Luke 12:15). He was teaching caution for the place of hypocrisy in one's life, and between these two brothers there was something covered, "There is nothing covered that will not be revealed" (Luke 12:2). Covetousness insists that whatever you see someone else possess, you should possess that very thing because you could do better with it. It's one thing to deceive your fellow man, it's pointless to think you can deceive God, thus His word of concern for being true to God. He cares for you, don't ever think otherwise, that's why the hairs of your head are numbered (Luke 12:7). His words of confession blend the genuineness of the caution against hypocrisy and His concern for eternity through saying that His name and His word ought to be seen in all you are (Luke 12:8). I hope you know, while we're busy.

...We express our sympathy to the family of Karen Rial Powers who passed away. She was a cousin of Polly Lancaster and Bobby Breece.


...We express our sympathy to the family of Gary Garrett who passed away. He was the brother of Liz Bryant.


