"I Hope You Know"

"We then, as workers together with Him also plead with you not to receive the grace of God in vain. For He says: 'In an acceptable time I have heard you, and in the day of salvation I have helped you.' Behold, now is the accepted time; behold, now is the day of salvation" (II Corinthians 6:1-2).

Cliches of time capture our struggle with utilizing this present constant in our lives. Have you ever wondered, what's the Drug Task Force and what is it they do? Wondering what it's like to be an undercover narcotic officer or an Interstate Criminal Enforcement officer working America's highways? This free academy is designed to educate residents, teachers, parents, grand parents, business owners, and even police officers, how your Drug Task Force operates and what is out there to deal with. This drug academy class will meet once a week for 9 weeks from 6:00 p.m. until 9:00 p.m. on Wednesday evening with a brief devotional and light meal provided by the Church.

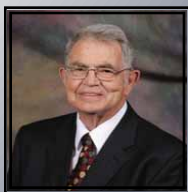
