"I Hope You Know"



ibelieve - Jesus, the Christ, is the Son of God. He came to the earth as a man, yet set aside all the privilege of being God, and became everything every soul would ever need to find healing, hope, and the way to heaven. His words are full of truth, just as He is. The Scriptures which speak of Him are infallible. My interpretation, understanding, and perception must always be scrutinized; but His word, His teaching, everything He is, will endure forever. The best news is, if I believe in Him, if I believe Him, all that He has said to me is true, then I will live with Him, forever. Philippians 2:5-8, John 1:14; 14:1-4; 12:48, II Corinthians 13:5, II Timothy 3:16-17, and John 11:26 are His truths teaching us to believe.

ibelieve - Jesus controls, and thus can do all things, especially when it comes to knowing when to do them. His words at the wedding in Cana of Galilee were not mere words, they were the theme of His entire ministry, "My hour has not yet come" (John 2:4). He controls the timing of how lives can change. He controls the way lives are changed by turning them into a brand new life for the sake of the soul living an abundant life here and hereafter. When Jesus turned water to wine at Cana of Galilee, His first sign of being the Messiah was to reassure all, no matter what, He can make you new and fill up the empty, and make you extraordinary.

ibelieve - Jesus confronts what needs removing. He entered the temple (John 2:13-17), and knew there was so much wrong, so much defiled, so much being denied when it came to the pursuit of the holiness the temple represented. He confronted who needed confrontation. He cleansed what needed cleansing, and He completed what needed completing, namely the scriptures of prophecy (John 2:17).

ibelieve - Jesus consoles the hearts of those burdened by the cares of sorrow and sadness and wants me to know I am not alone. His tears at the grave of Lazarus give me the assurance He knows how I feel when I am grieved (John 11:35). When He wept, He answered the anger that comes in death and grief (John 11:21). When He wept He answered the assurance we seek when a death has touched our hearts (John 11:25). When He wept He answered the aloneness which so easily overwhelms the heart in the time of death (John 11:33). Jesus consoles us, when no one else can, He reaches us.

ibelieve - This is our theme for vacation bible school, but I pray you see the lessons we can all learn from the works of our Lord Jesus. Each year we invite and encourage our young people to attend VBS, and this year is no different. At the same time we want to call on our adults and friends of the community to share the days with us and take part in the learning and study of God's word. This Sunday morning we will highlight part two, Jesus Confronts, and His words will point us to the cleansing He promises. I hope you know we want to share this time with you and look forward to seeing you Sunday and for VBS, June 20-22.

...Marie Lawhon has been moved back to the Life Care Center.

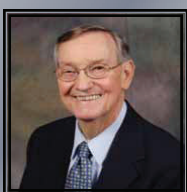
...Allison Hubbard, the great niece of Karen Bridges, is recovering from eye surgery at Vanderbilt Hospital.
