"I Hope You Know"

"LORD, my heart is not haughty, nor my eyes lofty. Neither do I concern myself with great matters, nor with things too profound for me. Surely I have calmed and quieted my soul, like a weaned child with his mother; like a weaned child is my soul within me. O Israel, hope in the LORD from this time forth and forever" (Psalm 131).

Two words may summarize these 61: "calm down." When our souls are burdened by our own worries and anxieties, it is often the result of our seeking to find the answers to the unknowns we have encountered. Yet it would be the heart that finds peace that has first sought to reconcile its own limitations. Let's be more personal, when your heart has reached a measure of calm you may have very successfully realized the two things suggested by a highway marquee, "Two things are true: 1) There is a God. 2) I am not Him."

The journey to calm begins with the first step within our soul which is humility. It is upon this "one" the Lord will look; it is what is "required" of you as a child of God (Micah 6:8); it is what one must do in order to be converted (Matthew 18:4). The humble spirit is ready to yield its position to God when it comes to matters of the unknown. The one who is faithful and true can supply the answers of our soul.

SHARING HEAVEN IN 2011



Our calm comes in life when we can see our God meeting our needs through all His providential care for us. Do we hunger for Him? What is more, do we trust Him to feed our real need?

The last step on our journey to calm is the greatest step of all, our expectation, our hope. The call goes from the Psalmist to Israel, "hope in the Lord."
