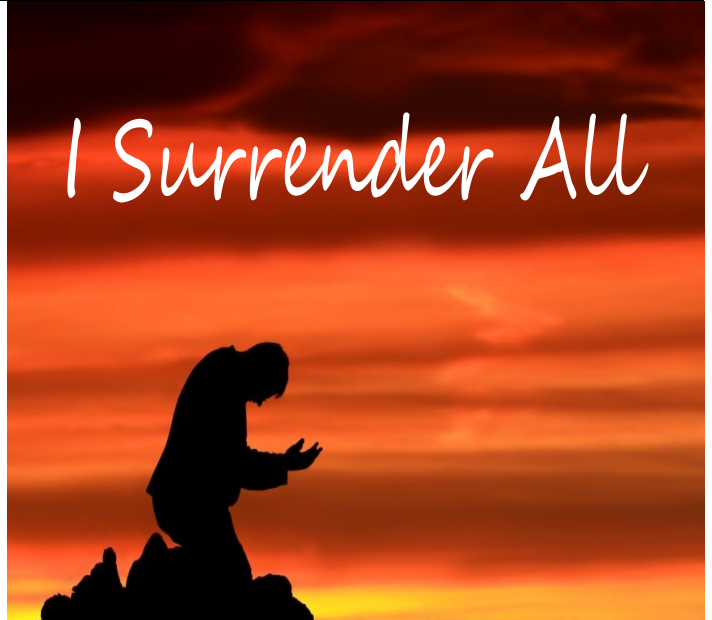

"I Hope You Know"

When John opens the last chapter to his gospel of belief, he sets the scene on the shores of a sea in Galilee, the sea of Tiberias. Peter decides he is going to fish. Lest we see it through our eyes, remember to look at it through the eyes of Peter and the others. Before you say, "How could they?" stop for a heartbeat and ask, "Knowing only what they knew, what would I have done?" What did you do when your world was turned upside down in the blink of an eye? What did you do when your nest egg cracked, your savings were spent, and your job was gone? What did you do when the news came from the doctor, "It's cancer...it's inoperable...it's stage 4...when the call came and said it's Dad...it's Mom...it's your grandpa...you'd better hurry."

"Follow Me" were the words they heard in their ears when they had just told Jesus, "We're not worthy." Three years would seem like a lifetime had passed by when they hear these two simple words spoken again. The first time they heard these words, they were in the most familiar territory of their lives, fishing at sea, in one of their own boats. Jesus had stood in the midst of an audience and then set foot in the boats of weary fishermen, who had pulled their boats to shore, mended their nets, and then set back out to sea to try again. When Jesus went out to sea with them, at His command, they lowered their nets once more, and their catch was beyond belief and so was their life change. They walked off the job (Luke 5:11).

In the three years that unfolded, life as we know it for the followers of Jesus has been turned upside down, inside out, and every which way but loose. But in a matter of hours, their world and the One Who was at the center of that world had been arrested, tried in a court of public opinion (not of law), remanded to the Roman authorities, crucified, and buried in a borrowed tomb. On the first day of the week, when the tomb was found vacant, Peter and John are the first to come at the behest of Mary, but they find no Jesus (John 20:1-10). That night, Jesus appeared



to them, revealing the scars of His hands and His side (John 20:20). Eight days later, He would do the same, this time with Thomas in the group (John 20:27). Yet there was still something missing, and so it would be, as the old saying goes, "third time's a charm" (John 21:14)

You talk to a Man you saw killed and buried, and see how clearly you are thinking when you see Him. You talk to a Man who retains His wounds of death but lives, and see if you make any sense. To John's credit, he more often than the other gospel writers, reminds his audience of their lack of understanding as their journey with Jesus was unfolding (John 2:22, 8:27, 10:6, 12:16, 13:7; John 20:9). Three years would pass between the time of Luke 5:11 and John 21:19, but the call would be the same, "Follow Me." When our Lord makes this appeal to every heart, we should believe and trust He is able to see and meet each need, each fear, and each struggle we face in our world and life. To follow Jesus means we surrender our will for the sake of His own. This is the message all Christians must believe. I hope you know, our greatest life begins when we surrender all things of our self to follow the life of our Lord Jesus Christ.
